45% feel optimistic about the upcoming holiday season, up from **33%** last year.

35% plan to do the majority of their holiday shopping at brick-andmortar stores, compared to 30% last year.







While holiday spirits are up, Canadians plan to spend \$555 on gifts this year, a small decrease from \$588 in 2020.

TRAVEL, ENTERTAINMENT AND GIFTING PLANS

of Canadians plan to 5/0 spend less than \$200 on holiday travel in 2021 - the same as last year.
